# PROFILE OF THE COLLEGE

**Pazhassi Raja N. S. S. College** is named after the great patriot **Sri. Kerala Varma Pazhassi Raja**, the Martyr who stands unique among the rich array of freedom fighters, and was founded by the illustrious leader, social reformer and great educationalist Padmabhooshan **Sri. Mannathu Padmanabhan**. Pazhassi Raja N.S.S. College had its beginning as a junior College in 1964. Now it is one among the several educational institutions of **Nair Service Society** (N.S.S.), a leading organisation which renders its contribution to various service areas with several institutions of higher learning, like Arts and Science Colleges, Training Colleges, Engineering Colleges, Polytechnics, High Schools, Higher Secondary Schools, Vocational Higher Secondary Schools, Hospitals and Paramedical Institutions.

This College is the fulfilment of the long cherished aspirations of socially and educationally backward people in the eastern side of Kannur district. In the initial periods of its establishment this was the only institution to meet the requirements of higher education of the people in the neighbouring villages.

Sri. M.P. Moidu Haji, the first local committee chairman whose services for the establishment of the college are unforgettable, laid the foundation stone of the College on 19th April 1964. We have here an extensive campus of over 105 acres donated by the generous members of the local public.

The inauguration of the Degree Courses was solemnised by the then President of Nair Service Society, Sri. Kalathil Velayudhan Nair on 12th August 1967. Since 1999, Post Graduate course in Commerce (M.Com.) has been offered by the college. Since its beginning, we are proud to say that it has been progressively achieving excellence in curricular, co-curricular and extra-curricular activities. On 4th September 2010, National Assessment & Accreditation Council (NAAC), Bangalore, accredited the College with B grade. **Now the college is re-accredited by NAAC with B+ grade on 30.10.2017.** In addition to academic achievements, the college has a unique reputation for sports and games. The college has marked its prestigious presence in Volley Ball at University & Inter University level tournaments for several years.

Formerly the College was affiliated to Kerala University and with the formation of Calicut University the college came under it. Now the college is affiliated to Kannur university.

## GENERAL RULES & REGULATIONS

### ADMISSION

Application for admission must be made through the online portal of Kannur University.

1. Candidates selected for admission will be required to appear for an interview with the Principal. The selection is provisional and is subject to confirmativon only after the interview and scrutiny of certificates.
2. Students seeking admission to the College from other universities should apply for University recognition.
3. Candidates seeking admission must produce at the time of the interview the transfer and conduct certificates in original from the school or college they last attended, besides the qualifying certificates and mark lists.
4. Candidates who are selected for admission will have to pay the instalments of tuition fees due at the time of admission, caution deposit and all other fees prescribed by the college before they start attending classes. Fees once paid will not be refunded.
5. Any candidate who is found to have obtained admission by false representation will be summarily dismissed and shall forfeit whatever fee she/he may have paid.
6. Students belonging to scheduled castes and scheduled tribes and the converts from these castes and tribes as evidenced by their SSLC certificate need not pay the tuition fees. Students belonging to other back-

ward classes and converts from them should produce community and income certificates from the regional Tahsildar at the time of admission, failing which they will not be exempted from the payment of fees.

7. A student applying for a transfer certificate will not be given the certificate unless he/she pays all fees or other dues or such portion thereof as the Principal may deem fit to demand for the academic year in which he/ she was last enrolled. Usually transfer certificates are not issued to students before the completion of their course of study.

8. A fee of Rs. 55/- will be charged if a student applies for TC after one year from the date of beginning of the academic year immediately following that during which he/she has been last enrolled. A fee of Rs. 105/- will be charged for the issue of a duplicate transfer certificate.

9. Students who leave the college on TC are not eligible to get a conduct certificate for the second time. However duplicate of the certificate originally released will be issued.

10. A student applying for the return of his/her SSLC book or any other certificate from the college must have cleared all his/her dues to the college. If any document is desired to be sent by post sufficient postal stamps to cover postage and registration should accompany the application.

11. A student applying for the release of a document from the College must have cleared all dues to the college.

12. A late fee of Rs. 5/- will be charged for a document that needs reference to records older than five years.

## **FEE RULES**

1. Fee structure and rules are liable to be modified in keeping with the directions and orders issued by the Kannur University and the Government of Kerala from time to time.

2. Tuition fees shall be collected in two instalments in the months of June and November for degree courses and in two instalments in the months of June and November for P.G Courses. In the case of first year students the first instalment of fees shall be collected at the time of admission along with the special fees and caution deposit.

3. Subsequent instalments will be collected on or before the seventh working day of the month concerned. The specific schedule in this regard shall be decided and published by the Principal. The Principal is competent to effect alterations in the schedule under special situations.

4. Students who fail to pay the fees or special fees on the due date shall be liable to pay a fine of Rs.5.00 along with the fees or special fees on or before the 10<sup>th</sup> day subsequent to the 7<sup>th</sup> working day. If the 10<sup>th</sup> day happens to be a holiday the next working day will be counted as the 10<sup>th</sup> day.

5. On expiry of the second chance for paying the fees a student will have to pay a fine of Rs.10.00 and a readmission fee of Rs.60.00.

6. The last opportunity for payment of an instalment of fee mentioned above is defined as last working day previous to the due date of the succeeding instalment. However this is not applicable in the case of the last instalment.

7. Students who are admitted for a term for making up shortage of attendance should pay full of the tuition fees for the year together with full special fees and caution deposit at the time of admission.

8. A student who leaves a particular college affiliated to any of the

universities in Kerala and joins another college so affiliated during the course of a term is liable to pay the prescribed fees for the term concerned in both the colleges.

9. In the case of students admitted late after the commencement of academic year, the fees for the preceding month if any shall be collected at the time of admission.

10. Refund of fees including special fees once remitted will not be granted except under exceptional circumstances and calls for special orders from the authorities concerned. Zonal Deputy Directors of collegiate education are empowered to sanction refund of fees.

## **CAUTION DEPOSIT**

1. The caution deposit paid by a student for a particular course shall be refunded to him/her after adjusting dues if any upon the completion of the course.
2. It shall be the responsibility of the student to claim the refund of caution deposit within the stipulated time.
3. The application for refund of caution deposit shall be submitted in the prescribed form together with the form of receipt.

## **ATTENDANCE AND LEAVE**

1. Students are not permitted to be absent from classes without proper applications for leave submitted in advance. In case of unforeseen circumstances the leave application should be submitted not later than the first day of return to the College.
2. Absence for a period will be considered as absence for a session and absence of one period each in forenoon and afternoon will be considered as absence for the whole day.
3. A student who is absent from the College for more than 12 consecutive working days without satisfactory explanation is liable to have his/her name removed from the roll and his/her re-admission is subject to the decision of the Principal.
4. The student should have earned at least 75% of the attendance prescribed by the College for promotion to the next senior class.
5. Students seeking exemption from rules relating to minimum attendance should apply for exemption to the University through the principal. Exemption will be given only for twelve days in entire programme in two spells for 2013 admissions. For 2014 admission onwards there are 24 days for a exemption- ie, 12 days per semester for 2 semesters in entire programme.
6. Students are not entitled to get attendance on producing medical certificate

## **UNIFORM**

Students should wear uniform in specified colour and pattern on all working days except Wednesdays.

## **IDENTITY CARD**

The identity card which is issued to the students at the time of admission shall be retained by the students and produced on demand. Duplicate cards will be issued only under exceptional circumstances and that too at the recommendation of the tutor and on payment of Rs. 50/- by the concerned student. The Identity Card is to be surrendered to the College before the issue of T.C. and Conduct Certificate.

## ETIQUETTE

1. With regard to all matters concerned with their conduct in and out of the College, the students of the College are expected to conduct themselves in accordance with the best standards of manners and behaviour.
2. Students shall wear clean and respectable dress.
3. In order to maintain order and discipline, students are required to make as little noise as possible when they move from one class to another.
4. When a teacher enters a class the students should rise and remain standing until he/she takes his/her seat or desires them to sit.
5. No student shall enter or leave the class without the permission of the teacher when the class is in progress.
6. Students are not allowed to loiter along the veranda or corridors of the college talking or laughing aloud during class hours. Students who have no class during any particular hour shall remain in the reading room.
7. The students shall handle all College property with care. They are not allowed to disfigure the building or compound walls, desks or benches with any writings, engraving or by sticking bills and posters.
8. Students are not allowed to organise or conduct meeting in the college or collect money for any purpose without the written permission of the Principal.
9. Smoking and chewing of tobacco are strictly prohibited within the College premises.
10. Use of mobile phones with Camera are banned in the campus. The mobile phone should be kept in a switched off mode in the institutions.
11. Students are prohibited from making representation in a body but they can make representations individually to the Principal.
12. Students are not allowed to take part in any agitation or procession which may be accompanied by or may result in illfeeling between different sections of the community, or which tend to excite feelings of disloyalty or dissatisfaction.
13. Irregular attendance, insubordination to teachers, habitual absence during class work, obscenity in word or act are sufficient reasons to be put on record in the punishment register or for being suspended or expelled from the College.
14. A student whose name has gone into the punishment register of the college may not receive a certificate of conduct and character from the Principal.
15. Students should take note of the departmental and other notifications put on the notice board every day before they leave the College. Failure to look at the notice board will not be an excuse for any act of omission or commission on their part.
16. All students of the college are required to carry their identity

cards with them.

17. Prohibition of political activity in campus and the penal provisions NSS Management has decided to ban forthwith all political activities of

the students in the campus. No student shall get involved in any political activity by him or abet the said activity to be carried on by fellow students inside the campus in any manner whatsoever and any such activity is hereby banned inside the campus.

Taking part in any political activity by organizing or causing gatherings inside the college campus for the purpose of doing any activities as defined in rule 4 (6) shall constitute serious indiscipline. Every member of such a gathering shall be individually liable and responsible for the gross indiscipline in this regard and the principal shall have the power to take disciplinary action against students who indulge in the aforesaid activities.

It shall constitute gross indiscipline to all for an appeal to strike based on policies and ideologies that may be preached by the political parties to their student organizations or students wings. The participants in the strike as aforesaid shall be dealt with by the disciplinary authority and they shall be imposed appropriate punishment as mentioned in these rules.

No student of college shall stage or indulge in any activity like Dharna, Gherao, obstructing entry to and from any class room, office hall or other places inside the campus and such activities shall be treated as misconduct. No student shall shout slogans inside the classrooms, office or any other place inside the campus and obstruct and interfere or cause disturbance and nuisance to the ordinary functioning of the institution. These activities shall be treated as misconduct.

### **Court verdict**

*(Effective from 27.01.16)*

*The judgement of wp ( c ) 3177/2016 ( V ) strictly enforces the direction contained in 2016(1 ) KLT 180*

a) Any student on strike who disrupts the academic activity whether it be lecture, seminar, moot court or tutorials is liable to be removed by the police on complaint made by the head of the department or principal of the

college. College authorities can also initiate disciplinary proceedings against the erring student.

b) The members of the teaching faculty are empowered to take classes during strike/ dharna even if there is only one student in the class room and such teaching hour is liable to be reckoned.

c) No student has any sort of right to obstruct other eligible students from entering the classrooms or the portals of a college under the guise of strike, agitation or dharna.

## **ANTI RAGGING SYSTEM**

An anti ragging squad is functioning in the college. In case of any complaint the students can contact the squad members through phone or in person.

### **Kerala Ragging Prohibition Act 1998**

For the information of the students and their parents, the prominent parts, from the Kerala ragging prohibition Act published in 1998, forbidding ragging in the educational institutions of Kerala are quoted below.

1. By Ragging, it is meant any physical or mental torture or any disorderly conduct towards any student of an educational institution causing apprehension, dread, humiliation or agitation in him/her. It can be any harassment like insulting teasing, bullying or manhandling. It can also be forcing upon him/her to do something which he/she voluntarily wont dare to do normally.

#### **2. Prohibition of Ragging.**

Ragging is prohibited both inside and outside of an educational institution.

#### **3. The punishment for ragging.**

Any student involved in ragging/persuades other for ragging or advocates ragging/either inside or outside an educational institution shall be subject to a punishment of not more than two years imprisonment in addition to a penalty not over Rs. 10,000.

#### **4. Dismissal of a student.**

A student subject to the punishment under section IV is liable to be dismissed from the institution and is barred from being admitted to any other institution for a period of three years from the date of receipt of his/her dismissal order.

#### **5. (1) Suspension of a student.**

If a student/parent/guardian or any teacher of the institution forwards a written complaint to the head of the institution, he has to make an urgent

enquiry into the matter within 7 days of receipt of such a complaint. If the allegation is proved to be correct, the accused must be suspended with immediate effect and the matter must be referred to the police for further proceedings.

6. (2) As is said in sub-section 1, if a written complaint is received by the head of the institution, he has to make a detailed enquiry and if it is found baseless the complainant must be informed of it in writing.

#### 7. Abetting.

If the head of the institution refuses to take action in the manner described under section 6 or is negligent in initiation of any steps, he is to be treated as one abetting the crime and is liable to be punished under section

### **MEDICAL INSPECTION**

1. Every student of the first year BA., B.Sc. & B.Com. classes will have to undergo Medical Examination by a duly qualified doctor at the beginning of the year and at every alternate year thereafter, and the doctor will submit a report to the Principal.

2. If any deficiency is pointed out by the doctor at the time of medical examination the student concerned shall undergo treatment or resort to such remedies as prescribed by the doctor failing which he/she may be removed from the rolls of the College.

### **GRIEVANCE REDRESSAL MECHANISM**

A committee is constituted to look into complaints regarding continuous evaluation. Department level committee consists of the HOD, the teacher concerned and Department co-ordinator. The college level committee consists of the Principal, the HOD concerned and college co-ordinator.

### **TUTORIAL SYSTEM**

The tutorial system aims to strengthen the teacher-student relationship and also to act as a redressal forum for solving the grievances of the students. Every student is assigned to the care of a tutor. The student can consult the tutor and seek advice on all matters. Tutorial meetings are held weekly and in these meetings the students are encouraged to articulate their suggestions and complaints freely and informally. The tutors are entrusted with the charge of convening class PTA meetings at regular intervals and keeping the guardians informed of the progress of their wards.

## FACILITIES

### LIBRARY & READING ROOM

The College has a fully automated Central library with a full time librarian and supporting staff. The library is open to the use of the students on all working days from 9.30 am to 4.30 pm. The library has a Central section, a reference section and a section for periodicals. A library advisory committee entrusted by the College Council monitors the functioning of the library.

#### **Library Rules.**

1. The Central library and reading room will be opened from 9.30 am to 4.30 pm on all working days. The schedule of working during vacation would be duly announced.
2. Books from the Central library will be issued as notified by the librarian.
3. A Library card will be issued to each student which has to be deposited with the librarian on borrowing a book.
4. Students must examine books issued to them and report to the librarian the damage if any, in the books before taking them away.
5. Books taken out by the students shall not be retained for more than 14 days from the date of issue. If the due date falls on a holiday the book must be returned on the next working day. Failure to return the book on the due date entails a fine of one rupee per day.
6. Spoiling or damaging a book by writing on it, underlining passages or by tearing away pages goes against the basic library etiquettes and are punishable with heavy fines.
7. If any book is lost, damaged or mutilated the borrower shall be required to replace the book with a fine or to pay such compensation as may be fixed by the Principal.
8. If books belonging to a set or series are damaged and a new volume is not separately available the borrower shall be required to replace the whole sector series. The damaged book set or series will be given to the borrower after its replacement.
9. Before leaving the counter the borrower shall examine the books taken by them and point out any mutilation or defect in any book to the librarian and have these defects etc. noted in the book and initialled by him. Otherwise the borrowers will be held responsible for any damage or mutilation observed later on.
10. It shall be the duty of the librarian and his staff to examine the books returned by the borrowers and take immediate action in all cases of mutilation or damage.

11. The transfer or sub-lending of books is strictly prohibited.
12. The papers and periodicals lying on the tables/racks shall not be removed from the slot allotted for each.
13. Strict silence must be observed in the Library/Reading Room.

## **COMPUTER CENTRE**

There is a centralized computer lab functioning in the College which caters to the needs of the students from all the departments. The computer centre offers certificate course in computer application packages and in DTP for the benefit of our students. Internet facility is available here.

## **PHYSICAL EDUCATION**

1. Students of the College are required to play games regularly and receive regular course in Physical Education.
2. Provision is made in the College to practice Athletics, Cricket, Basketball, Volleyball, Badminton, Shuttle Badminton, Soft ball, Kalaripayattu, Chess, and Boxing.
3. Annual college Sports and intramural tournaments will be conducted on a House basis. The House will be constituted by the Department of Physical Education.
4. The Physical Education Department is also having 12-stage Multi-GYM facility.
5. Recently a full fledged basket-ball court is also constructed with U.G.C. and Kerala State Sports Council support.

## **AUDITORIUM & SEMINAR HALL**

The auditorium and seminar hall of the college are well furnished and provide facilities which enable seminar presentations through audio-visual aids. Besides we are also having an open air auditorium.

## **GIRLS' ROOM**

A well furnished retirement room with toilet facilities constructed by PTA (2009-10) and common room for woman funded by UGC add girls' facilities and comforts.

## **SPORTS HOSTEL**

Sport Hostel attached to the college provides accommodation and provides special consideration to outstanding sportsmen.

## **WOMEN'S HOSTEL**

Women's Hostel offers accommodation and other facilities for 50 students. The Principal of the College shall be the warden of both hostels and he shall appoint a deputy warden who will be in charge of the daily administration. Application form for admission to the hostel can be obtained from the College office. A student, if permitted to reside in the hostel, shall pay the fees in this regard at the time of admission.

## **CANTEEN**

The College canteen provides light refreshments and lunch at a reasonable rate.

## **DRINKING WATER FACILITY**

The college has the facility to provide safe drinking water to students.

## **CO-OPERATIVE STORE**

The College houses a co-operative store inside the campus with the object of carrying out purchase and sale of text books, note books and stationery items. All students of the college and members of the staff are eligible for membership.

## **PHOTOSTAT**

Photocopying facility is available in the College office, Co-operative store, Library & Computer Lab.

## **POSTAL FACILITY**

Postal facility is available for students in the College.

## **PUBLIC ADDRESS SYSTEM**

The public address system echoes important announcements and the communication channel binds the college together.

## **INTERNET**

Internet facility is available in the College Central Library & Departments, apart from computer centre.

## WEBSITE

We host our dynamic web site [www.prnsscollege.ac.in](http://www.prnsscollege.ac.in) to make known the activities of the college.

## CENTRE FOR CAREER GUIDANCE, COUNSELLING AND EXTENSION

A Centre for career guidance and counselling is functioning in the college. The centre offers career and course guidance services for students at all levels. The centre provides detailed information on the facilities available for higher education available in the field of Arts, Humanities, Science, Engineering and Management in all the universities in Kerala and also in the rest of the universities in India. It arranges special programs for different groups of students for improving their career prospectus with the technical and professional assistance of various organisations and individuals.

The centre is also engaged in providing counselling to the students who are in the delicate stage of adolescence. The counselling programs of the centre will redress the mental and emotional anxiety on the part of adolescents in the campus which may be either due to their ignorance of adolescent issues or due to the lack of life skills to tackle such issues.

### Placement Cell

The placement cell functions under the auspices of the career guidance and counseling centre and provides placement assistance to final year students.

## STUDENT SUPPORT SYSTEM

Student Support System extends various kinds of support to the students of our college. Eligible students from difficult financial circumstances are selected and provided with free study materials and food from canteen. In addition to this, unforeseen contingencies of students are also addressed by the system.

## UGC CELL

UGC Cell of PRNSS College is functioning as a 5 member group. It is taking decision on UGC related matters like MRP, Seminar, Workshop etc. The cell is circulating the important circulars of UGC for the knowledge of teachers.

## RESEARCH CELL

A Research cell is functioning in the college with a view to nurture and to promote research culture among teachers in various disciplines. The members of the cell meet at regular intervals and encourage faculty members to take up research projects. A multidisciplinary journal is published by the

cell with scholarly articles of teachers in the college.

## **ADDITIONAL SKILL ACQUISITION PROGRAMME**

ASAP is a programme initiated by the Government of Kerala. It aims at equipping selected college students with skills in communication and selected areas of industry and service sectors. Our college is an authorized training centre under this programme.

## **ORGANISATIONS**

### **COLLEGE COUNCIL**

The College Council, constituted as per the Kannur University Statutes, would assist and advise the Principal in academic and administrative matters. It is headed by the Principal and has all the Heads of the Departments, Office Superintendent and two elected representatives of the staff as members. A meeting of the Council shall ordinarily be presided over by the Principal or by a councilor nominated by the Principal. A secretary shall be elected from among the members of the Council. It shall be the duty of the Secretary to give notice of the meetings of the council and to keep the record of its proceedings.

### **PARENT TEACHER ASSOCIATION (PTA)**

The objective of the Association is to foster and promote good will, understanding and co-operation among the faculty, the students and the parents/ guardians of our students. The Association seeks to encourage and facilitate the students in their curricular and co curricular activities. It also strives to device suitable ways and means to prevent student unrest and also to assist the College authorities in the smooth conduct of the institution. Further it is also the duty of the Association to encourage and participate in the development activities of the College.

Guardians of all students and members of the teaching staff are the members of the PTA. Each guardian should subscribe to the membership with a donation of Rs. 30/- at the time of admission. This amount and any other fund collected by the association will be utilized in consistence with the objectives of the association for the welfare of the College and the student community.

### **INTERNAL QUALITY ASSURANCE CELL (IQAC)**

As a post accreditation quality sustenance mechanism, IQAC functions in the college to plan, monitor and evaluate all administrative and academic activities. The Cell consists of Principal, nine Teachers, two members of the administrative staff, three local experts from the field of education and one parent and management representative each.

## COLLEGE UNION

All the students of the college are members of the college union. They shall pay membership fee as directed by the university, with the first instalment of fee.

Office Bearers of the Union are elected by the students every year. The major objectives of the union are to promote to awareness of the duties and responsibilities of citizenship, open up avenues for the development of character, leadership qualities, spirit of fellowship and selfless service among the students. Activities considered relevant to achieve these objectives have been regularly organised.

With a view of promoting interest in arts and literature, an arts club is functioning under the auspices of the college Union.

The College Union is affiliated to Kannur University Union.

## ALUMNI ASSOCIATION

The College has a rich and varied society of old students who are active in various walks of life. The Alumni Association encourages the former students to keep in touch with their Alma Mater and to maintain contact with one another. The Association also seeks to participate in the developmental activities of the College. Departmental Alumni Associations function to assist activities of respective department and to enable students to keep in touch with their department.

## NATIONAL CADET CORPS (NCC)

The NCC army wing unit of this College is functioning under the 31 Kerala Branch NCC, Kannur. The aim of NCC is to mould good citizens for the service of the nation. The unit has a strength of 106 cadets comprising 71 boys and 35 girls. NCC training is for 2 years during which time cadets are exposed to military training as well as leadership development programmes. Each cadet will have to earn 75% of attendance in the NCC activities for appearing for “B” and “C” certificate examinations. Trained cadets are eligible for bonus marks for higher education and reservations for jobs.

## NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME (N.S.S)

Two units of National Service Scheme are functioning in the college. The scheme provides opportunities for the students to participate in the process of national reconstruction and individual character formation. Social, educational, cultural and health awareness programmes are organised as a part of its regular activities to promote the leadership qualities and organisational skills. Annual camps are also conducted with special project in rural areas. Members of NSS are awarded grace marks for admission to higher classes.

**Regulations and Curriculum Framework**  
**(Effective from 2024 admissions)**

**KU-FYUGP - REGULATIONS**

1. *Title, Application and Commencement*
- 1.1 These Regulations shall be called ‘Kannur University Regulations for Four Year Undergraduate Programme(KU-FYUGP)2024undertheChoice Based Credit and Semester System (CBCSS).
- 1.2 The Regulation provided herein shall apply forall Four-Year Undergraduate Programme (KU-FYUGP) of KannurUniversity.
- 1.3 These regulations shall come into force with effect from Academic Year 2024-2025.
2. *Definitions* Unless context otherwise requires, -:
- 2.1 “Curriculum Committee” refers to the committee ‘constitutedbytheViceChancellorunderthese regulationsto monitorthe choice-based credit semester programme.One of the senior faculty members shall be the convenor of the committee in case of affiliated colleges and one of the senior professors shall be the convenor in case of university departments.
- 2.2 Academic Year” means two consecutive (one odd + one even) semesters followed by an optional summer fasttrack semester/vacation in one academic year.
- 2.3 “Act’ means the Kannur University Act.
- 2.4 Academic Coordinator: (i) is a teacher nominated by the college council to co- ordinate the effective conduct of the FYUGP including internal evaluation undertaken by various departments within the college. She/he shall be the convenor for the College level monitoringcommit tee. In the case of university teaching department, the academic coordinator will be a faculty nominated by

- the head of the department for the above purpose.
- 2.5 “Course” comprises papers which are taught and evaluated within a programme, including lectures/ tutorials, laboratory work, fieldwork, project work, vocational training, viva, seminars, term papers, presentations, assignments, presentations, self- study, internship, etc., or a combination of some of these elements
- 2.6 “Choice-Based” Credit System (CBCSS)” means the system wherein students have the option to select courses from the prescribed list of courses; and where in the requirements for awarding a degree, diploma, and certificate are prescribed in terms of the number of credits to be earned.
- 2.7 “Institutional-level academic committee” means a committee constituted for the FYUGP at the college level comprising the Principal as Chairperson and the Academic Coordinator as Convener
- 2.8 ‘Department’ means any teaching department in a college offering courses of study approved by the University as per the Statutes and the Act of the University and it also includes a department, centre, or school of teaching and research conducted directly by the University.
- 2.9 “Department Coordinator” includes a teacher nominated by a Department Committee to co-ordinate all the necessary work related to KU-FYUGP undertaken in that department, including continuous evaluation.
- 2.10 “Department Council” means the body of all teachers of a department in a college.
- 2.11 ‘Faculty Adviser’ means a teacher from the parent department nominated by the Department Council to advise students in academic matters.
- 2.12 “Graduate Attributes’: means the qualities and characteristics possessed by the graduates of a programme of study at the Higher Education Institution, which include the learning outcomes related to the disciplinary areas

in the chosen field of learning and generic learning outcomes. The university shall specify its graduate attributes for each programme.

- 2.13 “Programme” means the entire duration of the educational process including the evaluation leading to the award of a degree, and having a well-defined programme-specific outcome.
- 2.14 “Regulatory Body” means the University Grants Commission, All India Council for Technical Education, National Council for Teacher Education, and it includes Medical Council of India (MCI), Pharmacy Council of India (PCI), and Indian Council for Agricultural Research (ICAR), Bar Council of India, Council of Architecture, National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) and National Board of Accreditation (NBA);
- 2.15 “University” means any University in the state established by an Act of the State Legislature.
- 2.16 ‘Letter Grade’ or simply ‘Grade’ in a course is a letter symbol (O, A+, A, B+, B, C, P, F, and Ab). Grade shall mean the prescribed alphabetical grade awarded to a student based on his/her performance in various examinations.
- 2.17 Each letter grade is assigned a ‘Grade point’ (G) which is an integer indicating the numerical equivalent of the broad level of performance of a student in each course. Grade Point means a point given to a letter grade on 10-point scale.
- 2.18 ‘Semester Grade Point Average’ (SGPA) is the value obtained by dividing the sum of credit points obtained by a student in the various courses taken in a semester by the total number of credits in that semester. SGPA shall be rounded off to two decimal places. SGPA determines the overall performance of a student at the end of a semester ‘Credit Point’ (P) of a course is the value obtained by multiplying the grade point (G) by the credit (C)

of the course:  $P = G \times C$

- 2.19 'Cumulative Grade Point Average' (CGPA) is the value obtained by dividing the sum of credit points in all the semesters earned by the student for the entire programme by the total number of credits in the entire programme and shall be rounded off to three decimal places.
- 2.20 'Grade Card' means the printed record of students' performance, awarded to him/her.
- 2.21 Course faculty: A faculty member nominated by the Head of the Department shall be in charge of running a particular course in a particular semester of KU-FYUG programme
- 2.22 'Discipline Specific Signature Courses' (DSS)/Skill Specific Signature courses are the specialized elective courses or skill courses designed and offered by the regular/adhoc/visiting/emeritus/adjunct faculty member of a particular college with the prior approval of the BOS/Academic Council of the university/institute.

### 3. ***Features and Objectives of KU-FYUGP.***

- 3.1 The features, meaning, and purpose of KU-FYUGP shall be as stipulated by the UGC and as adapted by the Kerala State Undergraduate Curriculum Framework ( K S U C F ) .
- 3.2 The Kannur University FYUGP curriculum aims at the following:
  - 3.2.1 To increase access to higher education ensuring social justice and equity besides fostering scientific temper, secularism, and democracy.
  - 3.2.2 To improve the quality of higher education at all levels of research, teaching, and learning.
  - 3.2.3 To strengthen the knowledge society and contribute towards economic growth by means of increased innovation, entrepreneurship, and dynamism.
  - 3.2.4 To empower the knowledge society with social perception, multicultural adaptability, plurality, inclusiveness, solidarity and cooperation.

- 3.2.5 To provide student centric education thereby heading towards a people centered knowledge society.
- 3.2.6 To promote interdisciplinary and multidisciplinary learning and research.
- 3.2.7 To provide enormous opportunities for flexibility and choices for student learning and research through net work and collaboration.
- 3.2.8 To promote and emphasize learning by doing through self-engagement, assignments, seminars, practical workshops, and credit internships.
- 3.2.9 To promote critical thinking as learning philosophy as well as methodology.
- 3.2.10 To adapt new technologies and practices to improve the quality of learning and promote self-directed and curiosity-driven learning.
- 3.2.11 To design courses aligned with clear learning outcomes for developing student knowledge, skill, and competency to adopt a pedagogical approach based on OBE.
- 3.2.12 To consider assessment as an integrated and collaborative learning experience and employ effective assessment strategies and tools based on expected learning outcomes.
- 3.3 The practice of lateral entry of students to various years exists, but an exit with a Degree shall be awarded only upon successful completion of the third year.
- 3.4 KU-FYUGP shall have three Broad Pathways, (a) 3-year UG Degree, (b) 4- year UG Degree (Honours), and (c) 4-year UG Degree (Honours with Research).
- 3.5 Students who choose to exit after 3 years shall be awarded a UG Degree in their respective Major Discipline after the successful completion of the required minimum of Courses of 133 credits (133).
- 3.6 A four-year UG Honours Degree with Research in the Major Discipline shall be awarded to those who complete the KU-FYUGP

with a specific number of Courses of 177 credits including 12 credits from a graduate project/ dissertation in their major discipline. Students who aspire to pursue research as a career may opt for Honours with a Research stream in the fourth year.

- 3.7 A 4-year UG Honours Degree in the Discipline/ Disciplines shall be awarded to those who complete the KU-FYUGP with a specific number of Courses with 177 credits including an optional graduate project/ dissertation up to 12 credits in their major discipline.
- 3.8 The recognized research departments/ departments with at least two faculty with PhD may be permitted to offer the Honours with Research program
- 3.9 The number of seats for the Honours with Research shall be determined as per the availability of eligible faculty.
- 3.10 The selection criteria for Honours with Research stream shall be in accordance with the guidelines of UGC or as approved by Kannur University. Students who secure 75% marks and above (equivalent, CGPA 7.5 and above) cumulatively in the first six semesters are eligible to get selected to Honours with Research stream in the fourth year
- 3.11 Students who have chosen the Honours with Research stream shall be mentored by a faculty with a PhD.
- 3.12 The mentor shall prescribe suitable advanced-level courses for a minimum of 20 credits to be taken within the institutions along with the papers on research methodology, research ethics, and research topic-specific course for a minimum of 12 credits which may be obtained either within the institution or from other recognized institutions, including online and blended modes.
- 3.13 These students who have opted for the Honours with Research should complete a research project under the guidance of the mentor and should submit a re

- search report for eternal evaluation. They need to successfully defend the research project to obtain 12 credits under a faculty member of the University/College. The research shall be in the Major/allied discipline.
- 3.14 The research outcomes of their project work may be published in peer-reviewed journals or presented at conferences or seminars or patented.
- 3.15 The proposed KU-FYUGP curriculum shall comprise Three Broad Parts:
- a) Foundation Components,
  - b) Discipline Specific Pathway components (Major/Minor), and
  - c) Discipline Specific Capstone Components.
- 3.16 The Foundation component of the KU-FYUGP shall consist of a set of general courses and a set of discipline-specific courses.
- 3.17 General Foundation Courses shall be common for all students and shall be:
- 3.17.1 Grouped into 4 major baskets as Ability Enhancement courses (AEC), Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC), Value Addition Courses (VAC), and Multi-disciplinary Courses (MDC).
  - 3.17.2 Discipline-Specific Courses shall include Discipline-Specific Pathway Courses, both Major and Minor streams, enabling students to gain basic knowledge in the chosen discipline.
- 3.18 Discipline-Specific Foundation Courses shall focus on foundational theories, perspectives, principles, methods, and critical thinking essential for taking up advanced Courses. Preferably practical courses shall not be included in discipline-specific foundation courses. However, in the case of courses like music, physical education, and other vocational courses or as justified by the respective Board of Studies, where practical components are

deemed necessary for the foundation, they may be incorporated.

- 3.19 Ability Enhancement Courses shall be designed specifically to achieve competency in Modern Indian Language (MIL), and other world languages as per the student's choice along with the English language with special emphasis on language and communication skills.
- 3.20 The Modern Indian Language (MIL) or other language courses shall be designed to enable the students to acquire and demonstrate the core linguistic skills, including critical reading and academic writing skills, expository as well as the cultural and intellectual heritage of the language chosen.
- 3.21 Multi-disciplinary Courses (MDC) shall be so designed as to enable the students to broaden their intellectual experience by understanding the conceptual foundations of Science, Social Sciences, Humanities, and Liberal Arts. All UG students shall be required to complete three introductory-level MDCs relating to any of the broad disciplines and it shall be mandatory for all students to take one MDC in the Kerala Knowledge system. Students shall opt for the remaining two MDCs in any of the disciplines other than their chosen major discipline. **However students opting for major change to the MDC opted by them in first/second semesters, the above conditions shall not be insisted.**
- 3.22 Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) shall be designed to enhance workplace skills such as Creativity, Critical Thinking, Communication, and collaboration—21st-century skills.
- 3.23 The curriculum of the SEC should be designed in a manner that at the end of year- 1, year 2, year 3, and year 4 students can meet the level descriptors for levels 5, 6, 7, and 8 of the UGC Guidelines on National Skills Qualifications Framework (NSQF).

- 3.24 The progressive curriculum proposed shall systematically develop the knowledge and skills required, starting with novice problem solvers at the programme's entry level and progressing to expert problem solvers by the time of graduation.
- 3.25 The students should acquire the ability for well-defined problem-solving at the end of the first year and the ability to solve broadly defined problems at the end of the second year, and they should be able to demonstrate the ability to solve complex problems that require multidisciplinary skills at the end of the third year.
- 3.26 During the fourth year, the students shall engage in workplace problem-solving through projects and research experiences, which will help them develop adequate skills suitable for their higher education or entrepreneurship.
- 3.27 Value Added Courses (VAC) shall be so designed as to empower the students with personality development, perspective building, and self-awareness.
- 3.28 Discipline Specific Pathway Components (Major/Minor) shall provide the students with an opportunity to pursue in-depth study of a particular subject or discipline and develop competency in that chosen area, which includes Major courses, Minor courses and Optional Courses.
- 3.29 Minor Component Courses (MCC) should be selected from other disciplines that may supplement or complement the Main Courses (disciplinary-specific core courses or discipline-specific elective courses), but MCC shall not be from the student's major discipline.
- 3.30 Each Board of Studies (BOS) shall prepare a basket of Discipline Specific Courses from which the students can choose freely, their major and minor courses according to their requirements and competence.
- 3.31 Students who complete enough courses in a discipline or

- an interdisciplinary area of study other than their chosen Major shall qualify for a Minor in that discipline or in a chosen interdisciplinary area of study.
- 3.32 A student shall declare choice of the minor and vocational stream at the end of the second semester.
- 3.33 Major components shall be the focus of study. By selecting a major, the student shall be provided with an opportunity to pursue an in-depth study of a particular discipline.
- 3.34 Students shall be permitted to change their major within the broad spectrum at the end of the second semester after completing by giving them sufficient time to explore interdisciplinary courses during the first year.
- 3.35 Change of major and minor will be offered to disciplines where student have completed one DSC OR MDC during the first and second semester.
- 3.36 Major components consist of three types: Discipline Specific Core, Discipline Specific Elective Courses, and the research/laboratory/fieldwork.
- 3.37 The capstone -level courses shall be designed in such a manner as to enable students to demonstrate their cumulative knowledge in their main field of study, which shall include advanced thematic specialization or internships or community engagement or services, vocational or professional training, or other kinds of work experience.
- 3.38 Major specialization shall include courses focused on a specific area of study attached to a specific major, which could be an elective course. They shall include research methodology as well.
- 3.39 All students shall undergo a Field Trip/Summer Internship/Apprenticeship in a Firm, Industry or Organization; or Training in labs with faculty and researchers or other Higher Education Institutions (HEIs) or research institutions.
- 3.40 Students shall be provided with opportunities for internships with local industries, business organizations, agri

culture, health and allied sectors, Local Government institutions (such as panchayats, municipalities), State Planning Board, State Councils/ Boards, elected representatives to the parliament/state assembly/panchayat, media organizations, artists, crafts persons etc. These opportunities will enable the students to actively engage with the practical aspects of their learning and to improve their employability.

- 3.41 Social Activities shall include participation in National Service Scheme (NSS), Sports and games, arts, participation in university/college union related activities (for respective elected /nominated members), National Cadet Corps (NCC), adult education/literacy initiatives, mentoring school students, and engaging in similar social service organizations that deemed appropriate to the University.
- 3.42 Options shall be made available for students to earn credit by completing quality assured remote learning modes, including online programmes offered on the Study Webs of Active Learning for Young Aspiring Minds (SWAYAM) or other online educational platform approved by the board of studies from time to time.
- 3.43 Students can earn a maximum of 12 credits through online courses (**In the case of double major pathway maximum limit shall not be insisted**).
- 3.44 The University shall advise the students to opt for such Online/MOOC Courses that have a comprehensive graded evaluation with proper grades and grade points.
- 3.45 Students can earn a maximum of 12 credits from courses offered by other recognized institutions (including online courses) in the eight semesters. (In the case of double major pathway maximum limit shall not be insisted)

#### ***4. Eligibility for Admission and reservation of seats.***

- 4.1 The eligibility for admissions and reservation of seats for various KU- FYUGP shall be by the norms /rules made by the Government/ University from time to time.
- 4.2 No student shall be eligible for admission to KU-FYUGP in any of the disciplines unless he/she has completed the examination conducted by a Board/University at the +2 level of schooling or its equivalent.
- 4.3 Students shall be admitted and enrolled in the respective programmes solely based on the availability of the academic and physical facilities within the institution. The college shall provide all students with a brochure detailing the courses offered by the various departments under the various programmes, the eligibility criteria and the number of seats sanctioned by the University for each programme.
- 4.4 The students at the end of second semester may be permitted to change their major programme of study. Based on the availability of seats and infrastructure facilities the students may be permitted to opt any discipline which he/she had studied during the first two semesters as discipline- specific foundation courses/multidisciplinary foundation courses. If the student switches his/her major to a discipline in which an MDC has been done he/she will have to do additional DSC courses in the new discipline to acquire the required minimum credits.
- 4.5 Students shall be allowed to transfer their major programmes, if required, to a maximum of 10% of the sanctioned strength of that particular programmes depending upon the academic and infrastructural facilities available in the institution
- 4.6 During the time of admission each student may be provided with a unique higher education student ID which may be advised to link with the Aadhar number of the student so that this ID can be transferred if required to other higher education institutions as well.

- 4.7 Depending upon the availability of academic and physical facilities available in the Colleges and institutions the University may allow the Colleges and institutions to admit a certain number of students to 3,4,5,6,7 semesters from other institutions by transfer, within a period of two weeks from the date of commencement of the semester, if required, subject to the conditions as may be issued by the University. Such students should have been duly registered in the corresponding previous semesters.
- 4.8 The HEI can also enroll students from other recognized HEI who are already registered for a particular programme there, either through regular/online/distance mode irrespective of the nature of programme (aided/self-finance/autonomous), in certain courses as per their choice depending upon the availability of infrastructure and other academic facilities. On successful completion of the course the credits may be transferred through the Academic Bank of Credit, or it may be communicated to the university against the unique ID provided by the university at the time of admission.
5. ***Academic monitoring and student support.***
- The academic monitoring and student support shall be in the following manner:
- 5.1 Advisory System: There shall be one Senior Faculty Advisor (SFA) for each department and one faculty advisor (FA) for 20 to 30 students of the class to provide advice on all relevant matters. The Principal in consultation with the head of the department shall preferably assign a senior faculty member as the SFA. The Head of the Department, in consultation with the SFA, shall assign faculty advisers (FA) for each student.
- 5.2 The documents regarding all academic activities of students in a class shall be kept under the custody of the Faculty Advisor/Senior Faculty Advisor.

- 5.3 All requests/applications from a student or parent to higher offices are to be forwarded/recommended by his/her Faculty Advisor/Senior Faculty Advisor.
- 5.4 Students and parents shall first approach their Faculty Advisor/ Senior Faculty Advisor for all kinds of advice, clarifications, and permissions on academic matters.
- 5.5 It is the official responsibility of the institution to provide the required guidance, clarifications, and advice to the students and parents strictly based on the prevailing academic regulations.
- 5.6 The SFA shall arrange separate or combined meetings with advisors; course faculty, parents, and students as and when required and discuss the academic progress of students under their advisory group.
- 5.7 The Senior Faculty Advisor/ Faculty Advisor shall also offer guidance and help to solve the issues on academic and non-academic matters, including personal issues of the students in their advisory group.
- 5.8 Regular Advisory meetings shall be convened: immediately after the commencement of the semester and immediately after announcing the marks of the internal evaluation test.
- 5.9 The internal marks, classroom presence/participation, etc. shall be uploaded on the university portal only after displaying the same on the department notice board for at least for two working days.
- 5.10 Any concern raised by the students regarding attendance and internal marks shall be looked into in the combined meetings of advisors, course faculty, and the students concerned.
- 5.11 If the concerns are not resolved at the advisor's level, the same can be referred to the properly constituted departmental/college-level grievous redressal committees as per the existing UGC/University/Government norms.
- 5.12 The Principal/ HOD shall ensure the proper redressal of

- the concerns raised by the students regarding internal assessment and attendance.
- 5.13 If the students raise further concerns about the issue, the principal shall refer the issue to the university-level grievance committee with proper documents and minutes of all the committees.
- 5.14 The FA/SFA shall be the custodian of the minutes and action taken reports of the advisory meetings.
- 5.15 The SFA shall get the minutes and action taken reports of advisory meetings approved by the Head of Department and the Principal. It shall be the duty of the Head of the department and the Principal to produce them before the university as and when required.
- 5.16 Regular communication with the parents of students in respect of progress in academic matters and other general issues shall be the responsibility of the Senior Faculty Advisor/ Faculty Advisor.
- 5.17 The Principal shall inform/forward all regulations, guidelines, communications, announcements, etc. issued by the University regarding student academic and other matters to the HODs/Senior Faculty Advisors for information and timely action.
- 5.18 It shall be the official responsibility of the Principal to extend the required administrative and financial support to the HODs, SFAs and SAs to arrange necessary orientation programmes for students regarding student counseling, the prevailing university norms, regulations, guidelines and procedures on all academic and other University-related matters.
- 5.19 A Learning Management System (LMS) with all components necessary for the faculty to administer the courses conducted by them should be an integral part of the teaching-learning process. The LMS should also have functionalities which enable students to access all information related to the course including the

syllabus, announcements from the faculty regarding the course, and learning resources related to the course including study material, assignments, etc.

- 5.20 A software shall be developed by the university with required modules that helps the examination department with processes related to the issue of admit cards, gradesheets, convocation, transcripts, online question bank, online question paper delivery etc.

### ***6.Re-admission and Scheme Migration.***

- 6.1 Students who have discontinued the previous CBCSS regulations can resume their studies under the new regulations upon obtaining readmission, and such students must complete their programmes as per the new regulations.
- 6.2 Assessment of the transitory courses/ additional courses to be done by the student, as per the academic requirement of the University, shall be prescribed by the respective college/department where the student intends to take readmission, and the same shall be forwarded to the board of studies for approval.
- 6.3 Students who opt out before the completion of the third year shall be provided with a ‘Course cum Credits Certificate’ as proof for re-entry to another institution, and this certificate is essential for preserving the credits in the Academic Bank of Credits.
- 6.4 Students who have completed a particular programme pathway may be readmitted to take an additional minor, second major after successfully completing their programme.
- 6.5 Those students who are opting for a second major are eligible for getting certain credit transfer/credit exemption from their previous minor programs of study provided the BOS should recommend those credits as relevant for the present major programme of study.

- 6.6 There shall be provision for readmission of students **already registered under ‘FYUGP Regulation 2024’ subject to the condition** that the candidate seeking re admission to a particular semester should have registered/ taken registration for the previous semester examination.

## **7. Duration of programmes, credits requirements and options.**

- 7.1 In the programmes, the emphasis is on credits rather than a fixed duration, allowing for different lengths/durations of programmes.
- 7.2 Students will be offered the opportunity to take breaks during the programme and resume after the break, but the total duration for completing the programme shall not exceed six years for three-year and eight years for the four –year programme
- 7.3 Candidates who wish to complete the undergraduate programmes faster may do so by completing different courses equivalent to the required number of credits and fulfilling all other requirements in N-1 semesters (where N is the number of semesters in an undergraduate/postgraduate programme).
- 7.4 The candidates may complete both the undergraduate programmes in slower pace, -they may pursue the three years or six semester programmes in 4 to 5 years (8 to 10 semesters), and four years, or eight semester programmes in 5 to 6 years (10 to 12 semesters).
- 7.5 For students who crossed 6 semesters at a slower pace, the requirement of 16 credits from the institutions where they enrolled may be relaxed.
- 7.6 The higher education institutions shall admit candidates not only for programmes, but also for subjects or courses.
- 7.7 Student shall attain deficient credits under the provisions of the regulation, from their ongoing/sub

sequent semesters from same level or higher level courses.

8. ***Different types of courses/activities.*** The following types of courses/activities constitute the programmes of study, namely:

- 8.1 Lecture courses: Courses involving lectures relating to a field or discipline by a faculty member.
- 8.2 Tutorial courses: Courses involving problem-solving and discussions relating to a field or discipline under the guidance of qualified personnel in a field of learning,
- 8.3 Practicum or Laboratory work: A course requiring students to participate in a project or practical or lab activity that applies previously learned/studied principles/theory related to the chosen field of learning, work/vocation, or professional practice under the supervision of an instructor.
- 8.4 Seminar: A course requiring students to participate in structured discussion/conversation or debate focused on assigned tasks/readings, current or historical events, or shared experiences guided or led by an expert or qualified personnel in a field of learning
- 8.5(a) Internship: : A course requiring students to participate in a professional activity or gain work experience, or engage in cooperative education activities with an entity external to the education institution shall, normally, be under the supervision of an expert of the given external entity.
- 8.6 Studio activities: Studio activities involve the engagement of students in creative or artistic activities.
- 8.7 Field practice or projects: Courses requiring students to participate in field-based learning or projects shall, generally, be under the supervision of an expert from the given external entity. Community engagement and service: Courses requiring students to participate in field-based learning/projects shall, generally, be under the supervision of an expert from the given external entity. The curricular component

of community engagement and service' will involve activities that would expose students to the socio-economic issues in society.

9. ***Credit Structure***. - The proposed number of credits per course and their distribution for the undergraduate programmes are given below-

- 9.1 One hour of lecture or tutorial or a minimum of two hours of lab work, practical work, or field work per week is given one credit.
- 9.2 One credit in a semester should be designed for 15 hours of lectures or tutorials or 30 hours of practicum plus 30 hours of learner engagement in terms of course-related activities such as seminar preparation, submitting assignments, etc.
- 9.3 A one-credit seminar or studio activities or field practice project or Community engagement and service means two-hour engagements per week (30 hours of engagement per semester)
- 9.4 A course can have a combination of lecture credits, tutorial credits, and practicum credits.
- 9.5 Minimum credit for one Course should be 2 (Two), and the maximum credit should be 4 (Four).
- 9.6 All Discipline Specific Major/ Minor Courses shall be of 4 (Four) credits.
- 9.7 For all Discipline Specific Major/ Minor Courses, there may be practical/ practicum of two or four hours per week.
- 9.8 All Courses under the Multi-Disciplinary, Ability Enhancement, Value Addition and Skill Enhancement categories are of 3 credits.
- 9.9 Summer Internship, Apprenticeship, Community outreach activities, etc. shall require 90-120 hours/15-20 days of engagement to acquire 2 credits.
- 9.10 A student shall have the option of acquiring extra credits to a maximum of 240 credits for a 4-year (8-semester) UG program.

- 9.11 A student shall have the option of acquiring extra credits to a maximum of 180 credits for a 6-semester UG program.
- 9.12 Courses up to a maximum of 25 credits shall be designed for each programme in each semester with the available teaching hours for each semester. If there are no sufficient teaching hours online courses for equivalent level may be prescribed by the department
- 9.13 A student shall be able to opt for a certain number of extra credits over and above the requirements for the award of a degree.
- 9.14 Maximum number of credits that a student can take per semester shall be restricted to 30. **(In the case of double major pathway maximum limit shall not be insisted)**
- 9.15 Each faculty member shall offer a maximum of 16 credits per semester without practical or 12 -16 credits if practical is involved.
- 9.16 For a four- credit lecture course, 60 hours of lecture or tutorial class shall be assured as a mandatory requirement for the completion of that course.
- 9.17 An academic year shall consist of 200 working days; one semester consists of 90 working days including examinations; and an academic year consists of two semesters and an optional summer fast track semester.
- 9.18 Ten working days in a semester shall be used for extra curricular activities. One semester consists of 18 weeks with 5 working days per week. In each semester, 15 days (3 weeks) should be kept aside for exams, including internal examination evaluations and other academic activities.
- 9.19 The maximum number of available weeks for curriculum transactions should be fixed at 15 in each semester. A minimum of 5 teaching hours and 1 tutorial hour could be made available for a day in a 5-day week so that a total of 450 instructional hours (teach

- ing plus tutorial hours) will be available in a semester.
- 9.20 For the effective implementation of KU-FYUGP, a system of flexible timings and timetables shall be provided for the students and teachers as per the choice of each college.
- 9.21 Library and laboratory facilities shall be accessible for the students for at least three hours in addition to regular academic timings.
- 9.22 Faculty can opt for their convenient time, and they shall be present on campus at least 5 days a week for a minimum campus presence of 35 hours per week.
- 9.23 The students will get the support of the campus facilities for a minimum of 48 hours a week, out of which a maximum of 22 to 25 hours shall be devoted to contact classes and the rest of the time for other activities.

## 10. *Course structure of the KU-FYUG Degree*

### *Programmes.*

The KU-FYUG Programmes shall consist of the following categories of courses and the minimum credit requirements for each of them shall be as follows-

- 11.1 General Foundation Courses.
- 10..1. It is mandatory for all students who enroll in an FYUG degree programme to acquire 39 credits from general foundation courses, which are classified into four different sub-categories (approximately 30% credit is decided for the three-year programme)
- 10..2. The suggested credit distribution for each of the sub-categories of General Foundation courses is given below-

.a	Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC)	12 credits
.b	Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC)	9credits
.c	Value Added Courses (VAC)	9credits
.d	Multi-disciplinary Courses (MDC)	9credits

10.3 Discipline Specific Foundation and Pathway courses for 3-year Degree

10.4 The student who wishes to exit with a degree after three years needs to acquire 94 credits from Discipline-Specific Foundation and Pathway courses which is approximately 70% of the credit that has been decided for the three-year programme.

10.5 The suggested credit distribution for each of the sub-categories of Discipline-Specific Courses is given below. Based on the student's choice of the pathway the number of credits under major and minor may vary

a.	Major pathway courses	68 credits
b.	Minor pathway course	24credits
c.	Minor pathway course	2credits

10.6 Discipline Specific Foundation and Pathway courses for four-year Honours Degree.

10.7 Students shall successfully complete 39 credits from General Foundation courses and 94 credits from Discipline Specific Foundation and Pathway courses

- es as described above to enter for the fourth year for the Honours programme.
- 10.8 The student who enters the Honours programme after successfully acquiring 133 credits is required to earn an additional 44 credits within one year from the discipline specific capstone components, minor components and the research project.
- 10.9 The suggested credit distribution for each of the sub-categories of different levels of courses for fourth year is given below-

a.	Major pathway/capstone courses	20 credits
b.	Minor pathway courses	12 credits
c.	Research project	12 credits

## ***11. Course Registration/Cancellation***

- 11.1 Each department shall publish well in advance the relevant details of courses offered, such as the name, level, expected outcomes, timeslot, and names of faculty members.
- 11.2 Students shall be allowed to visit and interact with respective faculty members during the first week of each semester, to gather more information about the courses and the availability of seats.
- 11.3 Based on consultations and advice from the faculty adviser, each student shall complete course registration using the prescribed registration form within one week from the commencement of each semester.

- 11.3 The number of credits that a student can take in a semester is governed by the provisions in these regulations, subject to a minimum of 16 and a maximum of 30 credits. (In the case of double major pathway maximum limit shall not be insisted)
- 11.4 A student can opt out of a course or courses registered, subject to the minimum credit/course requirement, if he/she feels that he/she has registered for more Courses than he/she can handle, with in thirty days from the commencement of the semester.
- 11.5 The college shall publish a list of the students registered for each course along with the chosen programmes, and repeat/reappearance courses, if any, and shall forward the same to the university.
- 11.6 Students shall be permitted to cancel a Course for which they have registered/appeared for the examination upon their request and permitted to register for another Course. However cancellation of a Course shall not be permitted after completion of a Programme.

## **12. *Academic Level of courses***

The design of courses in various fields, aligned with the provisions of the regulations, shall be the responsibility of the Board of Studies. Courses shall be categorized and coded based on the learning outcomes, level of difficulty, and academic rigour.

- 12.1. Foundation Courses are intended to acquire fundamental understanding and basic knowledge of subjects and help students to decide on the subject or discipline of their interest. Discipline Specific Foundation courses shall be between 100 to 199 level as per the National Higher Education Qualification Framework (NHEQF)

- 12.2. Intermediate-level courses are subject-specific and are intended to meet the requirements of minor or major areas of learning. These courses shall be between 200 to 299 as per NHEQF.
- 12.3. Higher level courses are required for majoring in a discipline/interdisciplinary area, which come under 300 to 399 level as per NHEQF.
- 12.4. Advanced Courses – These are specialized cap stone courses including research projects and specialization courses meeting the level of 400 to 499 as per NHEQF.

### 13. *Programme pathways.*

- 13.1. In FYUGP the existing UG programme are modified into five possible structures or combinations, called academic pathways. Each pathway is defined by a specific combination of Discipline-Specific Courses (DSC). The seven pathways are the following:
- a. Single Major pathway: This pathway may be recommended to those students who opt for an in-depth study in a particular discipline, without systematically exploring any other discipline
  - b. Major with Minor pathway: This pathway may be recommended to those students who wish for an in-depth study in more than one discipline with a more focus on one discipline (Major) and relatively less focus on the other (Minor). The concept of Minor is relevant only when there is a Major discipline.
  - c. Major with multiple disciplines pathway: This pathway is recommended for students who wish to develop core competencies in multiple disciplines of study. In this case, the credits for the minor pathway shall be distributed among the constituent disciplines/subjects.
  - d. Double Major pathway: This pathway may be recommended to those students who wish for an in-depth study in two disciplines to more or less equal extent.
  - e. Major with Vocational Minor pathway: This pathway may be recommended to those students who wish for an exposure in a vocational discipline in addition to in-depth study in the Major discipline
  - f. Multi-disciplinary Major pathway: The programme offered by this pathway is of a multidisciplinary nature with credits distributed among the broad disciplines For multidisciplinary major pathway, the credits for the major and minor pathways will be distributed among the broad disciplines.
  - g. Interdisciplinary Major pathway: This pathway pro

gramme is offered jointly by two or three disciplines with credits distributed among the constituent discipline / subjects so as to get core competency in the interdisciplinary areas distributed among the constituent disciplines/subjects.

- 13.2 The existing regulations for the programmes should suitably align with these pathways/curriculum and credit structure.
- 13.3 The existing integrated programmes may be redesigned in such a way that the students may opt for an exit at third/fourth/fifth year with degree/Honours/PG as per this credit structure. Additional 44 credits may earmarked for the fifth year.

#### 14. ***Credit Requirement for Different Academic Pathways***

##### 14.1 Degree Single Major

The students pursuing KU-FYUGP in a specific discipline shall be awarded a UG Degree in a Major discipline if they secure minimum 68 credits in that Major discipline from 17 courses (50% of the total credits of 133 required for the three-year programme), out of which 10 courses should be above level 300.

Out of the remaining 26 credits required from discipline-specific courses in the first three years, 2 credits should be from Internship and 24 credits can be from any 6 discipline-specific courses other than the major discipline.

If the students continue to the fourth year of KU-FYUGP, to be eligible for a UG Degree (Honours) in the Major discipline, they should earn a further 32 credits in that Major discipline from Advanced level courses or project, and an additional 12 credits from any discipline.

Eg: BSc Chemistry Major; BA English Major; BA Economics Major

##### 14.2 Degree Major with Minor

If students pursuing KU-FYUGP are awarded a Major Degree in a particular discipline, they are eligible to be awarded a Minor in another discipline of their choice, if they earn a minimum of 24 credits in the Minor discipline at the end of third year; and 32 credits at the end of fourth year, to be eligible for a UG Degree (Honours) with a Major and a Minor.

Examples: BSc (Honours) Physics Major with Chemistry Minor, BA (Honours) English Major with Psychology Minor, B.Com (Honours) Commerce Major with Economics Minor

#### 14.3 Degree Major with Multiple Disciplines

If students pursuing KU-FYUGP are awarded a UG Degree in a Major discipline, they are eligible to get mentioned their core competencies in other discipline(s) of their choice if they have earned 12 credits from the pathway courses of a particular discipline. In the first three years of KU-FYUGP, this pathway is composed of one Major discipline with 68 credits from 17 courses, and maximum two other disciplines, with 12 credits from 3 courses in each discipline.

If the students continue to the fourth year of KU-FYUGP, the details of the credits in the Major discipline in the fourth year are the same as given for the Single Major Pathway. In the fourth year, the students need to earn an additional 12 credits from any discipline. These 12 credits can be in the form of three discipline-specific courses in any one discipline, in which case this third discipline will be added to the multiple disciplines of this pathway. Examples: BSc (Honours) in Physics Major with Chemistry and Mathematics, BA (Honours) in Economics Major with History and English

#### 14.4 Degree with Double Major It is composed of two Major disciplines with minimum 50% credits in one Major (A) and minimum 40% credits in another Major (B) out of

the total credits. In the three-year UG programme, it is specified that the student should earn minimum 68 credits in Major A and 54 credits in Major B to qualify for a UG degree with a Double Major. The required additional credits shall be earned from MDC, VAC, SEC, DSC(level 200-299, 300-399), DSE (level 200-299, 300-399) of the respective disciplines . The Double Major pathway is not extended to the fourth year. In the fourth year, the student can continue to earn the required credits in either Major A or Major B to qualify for a UG Degree (Honours) / UG Degree (Honours with Research) in A or B. If he/she opts to continue with Major B in the fourth year, he/she should earn an additional 14 credits of 300-399 level in B through in-person or online courses. Examples: BSc Physics and Chemistry Major, BA Economics and History Major, BCom Commerce and Management Major.

- 14.5 Degree Major with Vocational Minor In the first three years of FYUGP, this pathway is composed of one Major discipline with 68 credits from 17 courses, and when the student continues to the fourth year of FYUGP, the student will be eligible for a UG Honours Degree in a Major with a Vocational Minor, if they earn 32 credits in the chosen Vocational Minor discipline. Examples: BSc Physics Major with Data Analysis Minor, BA English Major with Translation Minor, BCom Commerce Major with Company Secretaryship Minor
- 14.6 Multidisciplinary UG Programme The overall fraction of major and minor constituent disciplines or broad disciplines should be 70 % of the total credits. For a 3-year programme the credit requirements in the constituent discipline should be 94 credits and for 4-year honours programme should be 124 credits including the project. Examples: Life Science, Data Science, Nano Science

- 14.7 InterdisciplinaryUGProgramme The overall fraction of major and minor constituent disciplines should be 70%. For a 3-year programme the credit requirements in the constituent discipline should be 94 credits and for 4-year honours programme should be 124 credits including project. Example: Econometrics, Global Studies, Biostatistics

### 18. *Assessment and Evaluation*

- 18.1 The assessment shall be a combination of Continuous Comprehensive Assessment (CCA) and an End Semester Evaluation (ESE)
- 18.2 The evaluation shall be done by indirect grading method
- 18.3 The End semester Evaluation shall be conducted according to the examination calendar of the University
- 18.4 Continuous Comprehensive Assessment includes assignments, seminars, periodic written examinations, or other measures as proposed in the syllabus and approved by the university
- 18.5 Each BoS shall provide detailed guidelines on the mode of assessment and weightage in accordance with the regulations and same shall be clearly specified in the approved syllabus
- 18.6 A copy of all records of CCA shall be maintained in digital format in the Department / College and shall be made available for verification by the University.
- 18.7 Performance of each student in an assessment shall be intimated to the student within two weeks of the conduct of test/ submission of assignment/ report.
- 18.8 Continuous Comprehensive Assessment (CCA) will have two subcomponents: Formative assessment (FA) and Summative Assessment (SA). The

- weightage of FA and SA shall be decided by respective BoS
- 18.9 The assessment are to be conducted by the teacher/ course coordinator handling the course. These assessments are to promote deeper learning, thinking and reflection to gauge student's achievement / performance.
- 18.9.1 Formative assessment (FA) refers to a wide variety of methods that teachers use to conduct in-process evaluations of student comprehension, learning needs, and academic progress during a lesson, unit, or course.
- 18.9.2 FA is to encourage students to build on their strengths rather than fixate or dwell on their deficits. Formative Assessment can help to clarify and calibrate learning expectations for both students and parents.
- 18.9.3 FA will help students become more aware of their learning needs, strengths, and interests so they can take greater responsibility over their own educational growth.
- 18.9.4 Formative assessment will be prerogative of the course coordinator based on specific requirement of the student.
- 18.9.5 Suggestivemethods of formative assessment are as follows: (any one or in combinations as decided by the course coordinator)
- a) Practical Assignment
  - b) Observation of practical skills
  - c) Viva voce.
  - d) Quiz
  - e) Interview
  - f) Oral presentations
  - g) Computerized adaptive testing
  - h) In-class discussions
  - i) Group Tutorial work
  - j) Reflection writing assignments.
  - k) Home assignments
  - l) Self and peer Assessments
  - m) Any other method as may be required for specific

course / student by the course faculty.

- 18.9.6 Summative assessments (SA) are used to evaluate student learning, skill acquisition, and academic achievement at the conclusion of a defined instructional period— typically at the end of a project, unit, course or semester.
- 18.9.7 Summative assessments may be a class tests, as signments, or project, used to determine whether students have learned what they were expected to learn.
- 18.9.8 It will be based on evidence, collected using single or multiple ways of assessment. The systematically collected evidence should be kept in record by course faculty and the marks should be displayed on the college notice board before the end semester examinations.
- 18.9.9 The method of summative assessment will be as follows: (any one as decided by the course coordinator).
- a. Written test
  - b. Open book test
  - c. Laboratory report
  - d. Problem based assignments.
  - e. Individual project report
  - f. Case study report
  - g. Team project report
  - h. Literature survey
  - i. Standardized Test
  - j. Any other pedagogic approach specifically designed for a particular course by the course coordinator.
- 18.9.10 A Student may repeat summative assessment only if for any compulsive reason due to which the student could not attend the assessment. The prerogative of arranging a CCA lies with the course Coordinator with the approval of Principal through the Head of the Department in which the student is admitted based on justified reasons.
- 18.9.11 The Course Coordinator shall be responsible for evaluating all the components of continuous assessment for the concerned subject of a course. However, the Uni

- versity may involve any other person (External or Internal) for Evaluation of any or all the components as decided by the Vice Chancellor / Pro-Voce Chancellor from time to time in case any grievances are raised.
- 18.9.12 Written tests shall be precisely designed using a variety of tools and processes (e.g., constructed responses, open-ended items, multiple-choice), and the students should be informed about the evaluation modalities well in advance.
- 18.9.13 The faculty may provide options for students to improve their performance through continuous assessment mode.
- 18.9.14 There shall be Theory and Practical examinations at the end of each semester, ordinarily during November for odd semesters and during April for even semesters, as prescribed in the Scheme of Examinations.
- 18.9.15 In case of ESE students shall secure a minimum 30%, irrespective of whether ESE has theory, practical or both the theory and practical components. In case of total ESE minimum 30% has to be secured; and in case of cumulative of CCA and ESE minimum 35% is required for successful completion of the course.
- 18.9.16 On demand examination: Considering the emergence of new technology-based methods and the integration of teaching-learning and examinations in novel forms, offering examinations on demand would provide greater flexibility and student-centricity.
- 18.9.17 Regarding evaluation, a one credit course may be evaluated for 25 marks, two credits for 50 marks, three credits for 75 marks and four credits for 100 marks.
- 18.9.18 In the evaluation of a 4-credit theory course of 100 marks, 30 marks will be by continuous comprehensive assessment and 70 marks will be by end semester evaluation. The duration for the end semester evaluation of the theory courses of 70 marks shall be for two hours. The

duration for the end semester practical examination shall be fixed by the respective BoS. For evaluation of the courses with both theory and practicum components, the marks for ESE and CCA may be fixed by ensuring the credit-mark relation (One credit corresponds to 25 marks) In the evaluation of a 3-credit theory course of 75 marks, 25 marks will be by continuous comprehensive assessment and 50 marks will be by end semester evaluation. The duration for the end semester evaluation of theory courses of 50 marks/ below 50 marks shall be of one and half hour (1.5 hr). The duration for the end semester practical examination shall be fixed by the respective BoS. For the evaluation of courses with both theory and practicum components, the marks for ESE and CCA may be fixed by ensuring the credit- mark relation (One credit corresponds to 25 marks)

18.9.19 In the case of courses with both theory and practicum, for

course components (Theory or Practicum) with even credits the ratio of continuous comprehensive assessment (CCA) to End semester evaluation (ESE) is 30:70 for the theory/lecture and 40:60 for practical/practicum. However, for course components with odd credits the marks are calculated following same proportion and are rounded to convenient whole numbers wherever necessary

18.9.20 The BoS shall follow the consolidated scheme given below for the evaluation of all 3 credit and 4 credit courses

L-Lecture/Theory, P-Practical/Practicum components, CCA-Continuous Comprehensive Assessment, ESE-End Semester Evaluation

The end-semester evaluation question papers for theory courses shall be provided by the university. The evaluation for the odd semester will be conducted at the college level itself and that for even semester will be conducted at the university level.

18.9.21 Individual learning plans (ILPs) and/or specific assessment arrangements may be put in place for differently abled students.

18.9.22 Suitable evaluation strategies including technology assisted examinations/alternate examination strategies may be designed and implemented for differently abled students.

18.9.23 Additional guidelines for internship / projects / community engagement, etc., will be issued by the University to be adopted by the concerned BOS.

18.9.24 Moderation shall be decided by the concerned board of examiners as per the university guidelines.

18.9.25 Revaluation is permissible under these regulations as per the prescribed guidelines of the university.

18.9.26 Re-admission for students of previous regulations is permitted as per prescribed guidelines of the university.

### **19. Evaluation of Practical Courses.**

19.1. The end-semester practical examination and viva-voce, and the evaluation of practical records shall be conducted by the course in-charge and an internal examiner appointed by the Department Council.

19.2. The continuous Comprehensive Assessment of practical courses shall be conducted by the Course-in-Charge

19.3. In case of courses having both theory and practical components, the components of CCA may be decided by concerned BO Sand shall be specified in the approved syllabus.

19.4. The process of continuous evaluation of practical Courses shall be completed before 10 days from beginning of end-semester examination.

19.5. If CE is entirely practical component and the student is absent for that course, the pending course shall be cleared during the next semester/ a fast track semester along with respective semesters .

19.6. Those who have completed the continuous evaluation alone will be permitted to appear for the end semester (practical) viva-voce.

19.7. For grievance redressal purpose, the University shall have the right to call for all the records of teachers' continuous evaluation.

19.8. The grades awarded in each semester (Continuous Internal Assessment and Practical Examinations) shall be forwarded to the COE (latest before 7 days from the last date of semester examination / one week before the last date of semester examination) after resolving all the grievances of the students.

### **20 Evaluation of Internship**

A student shall do an internship of 2 credits by the end of

the fifth semester . Since one credit corresponds to 25 marks, the internship shall be evaluated for 50 marks. The scheme of CCA and ESE is given below:

## 22. **Grading**

- 22.1 Mark system is followed for evaluating each question. For each course in the semester letter grade and grade tbpoint are introduced in 10-point indirect grading system
- 22.2 The Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA) is computed from the grades as a measure of the student's performance in a given semester. The SGPA is based on the grades of the current term, while the Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) is based on the grades in all courses taken after joining the programme of study. Based on the marks obtained, the weighted grade point will be mentioned in the student's grade cards.

22.3 A minimum of grade point 4 (Grade P) is needed for the successful completion of a Course. A student who has failed in a Course can reappear for the End Semester Examination of the same Course along with the next batch without taking re-admission or choose another Course in the subsequent Semesters of the same programme to acquire the minimum credits needed for the completion of the Programme. There shall be provision for a one time improvement chance of ESE along with the immediate subsequent batch. If the candidate fails to appear for the improvement examination after registration, or if there is no change in the results of the improvement examination, the mark/grade obtained in the first appearance will be retained. Candidates may be permitted to cancel their improvement registration/appearance if applied be

fore the publication of results, and after that application for cancellation shall not be permitted. There shall be no improvement chance for continuous evaluation, project/viva voce/practical. The marks already obtained for CCA will be carried forward to determine the new grade/mark in the improvement examination. For reappear/reappearance/improvement the students shall appear along with students of subsequent admissions as and when the examinations are conducted by the University.

22.4 Computation of SGPA and CGPA - The following method is recommended to compute the Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA) and Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA):

22.4.1 The SGPA is the ratio of the sum of the product of the number of credits with the grade points scored by a student in all the courses taken by a student and the sum of the number of credits of all the courses undergone by a student, i.e.  $SGPA (S_i) = \frac{\sum(C_i \times G_i)}{\sum C_i}$  Where  $C_i$  is the number of credits of the course and  $G_i$  is the grade point scored by the student in the course.

22.4.2 The Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) is also calculated in the same manner taking into account all the courses undergone by a student over all the semesters of a programme, i.e.  $CGPA = \frac{\sum(C_i \times S_i)}{\sum C_i}$  Where  $S_i$  is the SGPA of the semester and  $C_i$  is the total number of credits in that semester.

The SGPA and CGPA shall be rounded off to 2 decimal points and reported in the transcripts. Transcript (Format): Based on the above recommendations on Letter grades, grade points and SGPA and CGPA, the HEIs may issue the transcript for each semester and a consolidated transcript indicating the performance in all semesters.

Appearance for Continuous Evaluation (CE) and End Semester Examination (ESE) are compulsory, and no Grade shall be awarded to a candidate if the candidate is absent for CE or ESE or both.
